



## Preschool Discoveries

## **PRESCHOOL 1**

This week, Preschool 1 students have been exploring jungle habitats. Together, we decorated our classroom into a deep jungle forest. We have made jungle snakes and monkeys and hung them on our jungle trees. Each day we talked about different animals and insects that live in the jungle such as giraffes, lions, tigers, hippos, elephants, butterflies, crocodiles, snakes and more. We described some animals and explored animals features in our story times. Our friends suggested that giraffes have long necks because giraffes were pulled out of trees when their heads got stuck inside the trees whilst looking for honey. We also sang the "Walking In The Jungle" song and liked pretending to be animals that we may meet in the jungles. For art, we made giraffes with our fingerprints and a lion out of doily. Next week, we will continue to talk about jungle life.



## **PRESCHOOL 2**

Preschool 2 group continued talking about the food products, their impact on human health and the places where food comes from. We looked at products which are provided by the animals. We discovered that cows can make milk so people can have yogurt, cheese, cottage cheese, ice-cream and sour cream.

We also learnt about how humans interact with chickens. For some humans, chickens provide eggs which they may use to cook dishes and to bake yummy cookies. To inquire into ways a cow shares her milk, we made a huge cardboard cow, painted it into white with black spots and even tried to milk it. The children were very interested in this process. We finally used some educational videos to explore how the products are delivered from farms and distributed to shops where people come to buy them.

As we kept talking about these products being used in cooking, we decided to bake cookies using eggs, milk, butter and flour. We highlighted that all the products we use in making cookie dough are grown on the farm. The children were engaged in mixing the products and creating sticky dough. Some of them asked about the possible ingredients "Can we hatch 10 eggs to make dough?", "What if we don't add flour to the dough?", "What if we add candies inside the dough?". It was nice to see the children inquiring into alternative cookie recipes and sharing their home cooking experiences.

Happy Valentine's Day to all our wonderful BIS families. This week was full of learning about love and friendship as our preschool friends created beautiful "love hedgehogs" during their Kyrgyz lesson. We learned how to say "love", "huge heart" and "friends" in Kyrgyz. We also made a huge love heart book with Dr.Anna during our Art lesson. Aside from learning about love, we also learned about ordinal numbers during our numeracy circle time and the letter 'p' during our literacy time. We learned that the letter 'p' is for pirates, pants, parrots, pizza and party. To help us remember all of these precious letter 'p' words, we created a parrot for a pirate and read one of our favorite books "Pirates love underpants". We also made our own pizza and had a "pizza party" in the class. Next week we will learn about the letter "q" and the sound it makes. We will also try to tell our very own stories using puppets.
